McGill University students who successfully complete U2 of the BSc (AgEnvSc) Life Sciences (Biological and Agricultural) Major, Animal Health and Disease Specialization programme are eligible to apply to the four-year Graduate Entry Bachelor of Veterinary Medicine and Surgery programme (BVM&S) offered by the Royal (Dick) School of Veterinary Studies.

Students successfully completing the BVM&S via this pathway will satisfy the remaining credit required to graduate from their BSc (AgEnvSc) at McGill University.

To be eligible to apply, you must be in U2 of the BSc (AgEnvSc) Life Sciences (Biological and Agricultural) Major, Animal Health and Disease Specialization at McGill University, achieving good grades in your science classes, and be on track to have an overall GPA of 3.4 or above (on a 4 point scale) at the end of U2.

We also look for evidence of relevant animal handling experience.

Provided you meet these criteria, and subsequent to application, you will be invited to attend an interview in December - February. You will be informed about the outcome of your interview and overall application by the end of March.

If you are offered a place, it will be conditional upon the following:

- Achievement of an overall GPA of 3.4 or above (on a 4 point scale) at the end of U2
- Passing all of the science modules which make up the first years of your programme
- Meeting our English language requirements (if applicable)
- Payment of a deposit of £1,500 which will be deducted from your first year's tuition fee (refundable in the event that you fail to meet any of the other above offer conditions)

When pursuing this pathway, you should regularly consult with your McGill advisor to ensure that you continue to meet requirements for your McGill BSc degree.

The University of Edinburgh reserves the right to make final judgement on the admissibility of each applicant.



How to Apply

- 1. Complete a free online application form
- 2. Provide the following additional documents by email:
 - An up-to-date academic transcript from McGill
 - A reference from a McGill academic (can be submitted directly by the referee)
 - A summary of your educational background, including any English Language tests achieved to date (if applicable)
 - A personal statement of up to 500 words
- 3. Complete an online Work Experience Summary form

Things to bear in mind...

Work Experience

We do not request specific types of work experience or state days/weeks required, as it depends to some extent on the opportunities available to you. The broader your experience the better, but you should not gain experience to the detriment of your academic studies. You should, however, gain both veterinary practice and animal work experience.

Non-Academic Achievements and Interests

Your personal statement and references give us an idea of your skills, achievements and motivation, which are important factors in assessing your application. This could feature:

- Social involvement
- School responsibilities
- Leadership
- Organisational abilities
- Interests and hobbies
- Cultural, sporting, musical, vocational and voluntary achievements






U2+4 Route
