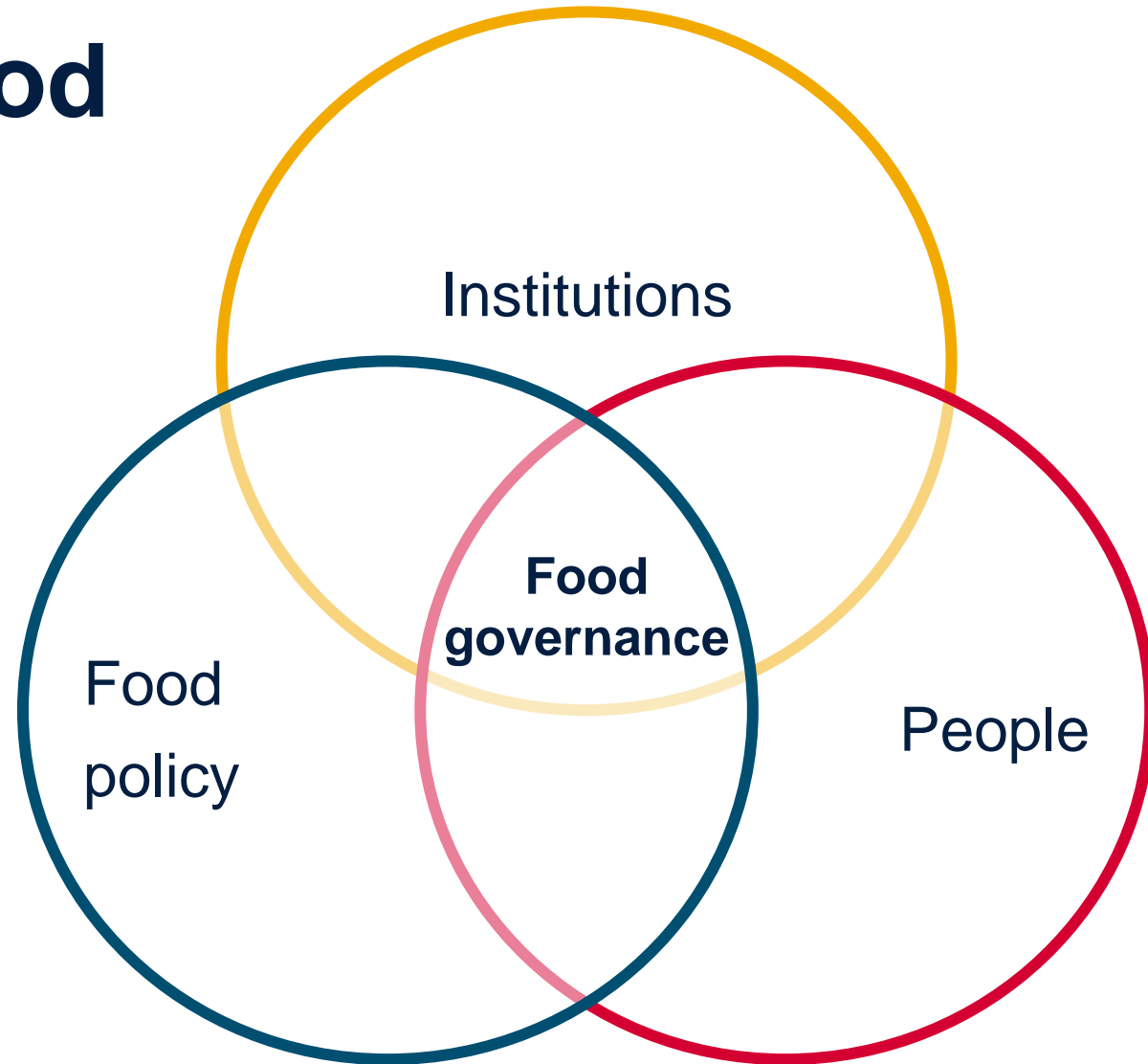

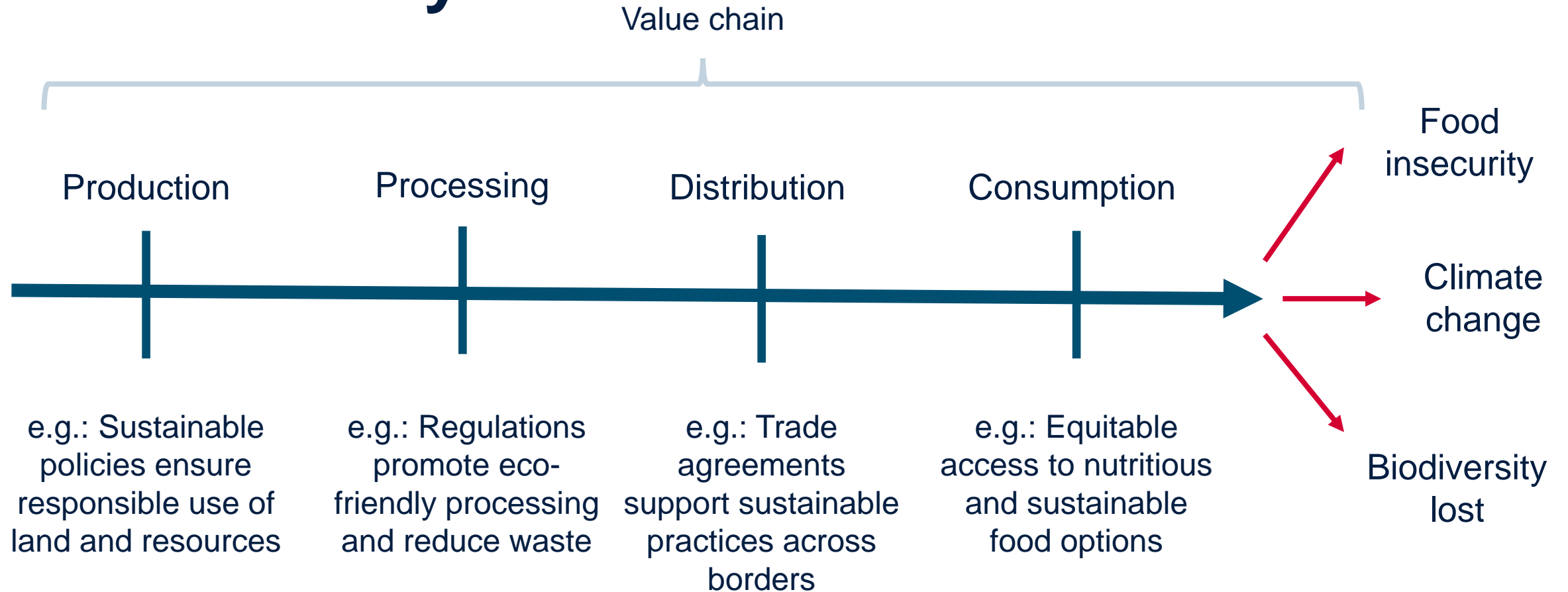

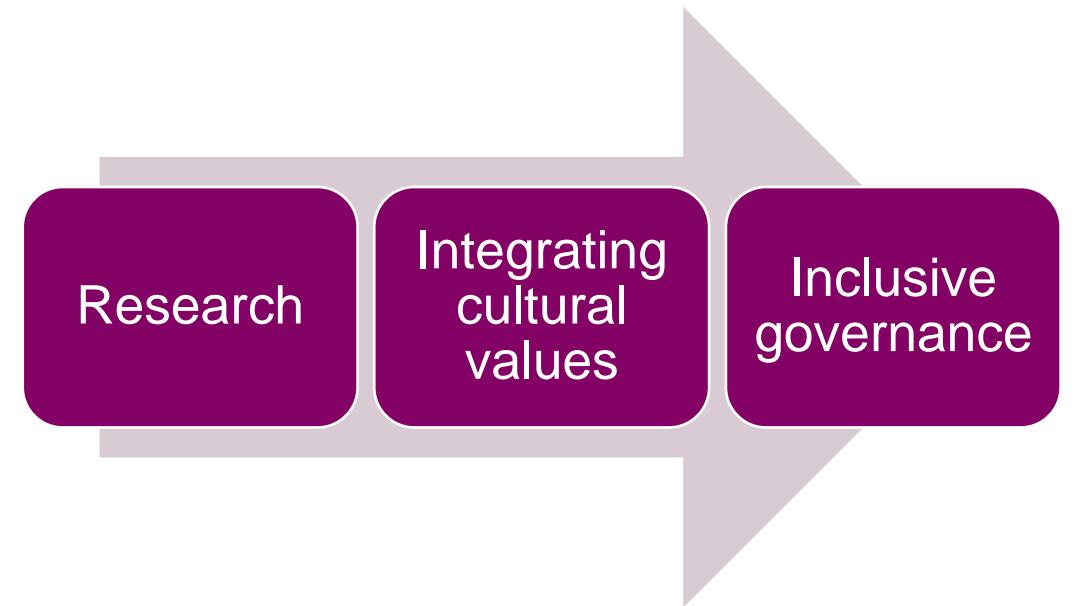
Conclusions and recommendations for the future
